## **Service Officer**

During the last six months to date our post has assisted 19 veterans in filing claims such as, initial claims, notice of disagreements, appeals, veterans pensions as well as filing for Social Security Disability (SSDI). Since I started keeping records this has entailed roughly 170 man hours and 433 miles.

This is quite a feat for a Post of this size and it could not have been accomplished without the help and support of all our Veteran members as well as non veterans. Of course I have to give a shout out to all our bar

tenders for passing along my point of contact to inquiring veterans.

On another not I want to bring everyone involved up to date on some issues that haven't published enough or at all;

- Out of work disabled veterans (no matter of % of disability) can file for Social security Disability (SSDI) and are qualified. I know I am one.
- Disabled/injured active duty military in some cases can apply for and receive SSDI
- Low income veterans can apply for a Veterans Pension
- Disabled veterans can apply foe Aid and Attendance for nursing home as well as house bound (house bound vets allows for paid attendance including your attending spouse

#### **ALERT**

VA adds three new presumptions for agent orange;

- Bladder cancer
- Hypothyroidism
- Parkinsonism

VA extends presumptive period for Gulf War veterans to Dec. 31, 2026. There a wide variety of systems that can qualify a Gulf War veteran for presumptive service connection, so veterans that are experiencing unexplained medical issues are encouraged to file a claim.
