Greetings! I am happy to have this opportunity to pass along some important information I have received from the VA.

The VA has added Parkinsonism, which is Parkinson like conditions, hypothyroidism and bladder cancer to the

Agent Orange presumptive list.

They have also widened the in-country service dates for Vietnam. The revised date is now 03 Nov 1955 vice the old date of 28 Feb 1961. If you fall into this category, then please contact the VA.

Effective 07 Feb 2021, the VA has changed the convalescent time from 12 months to 5 months for knee replacements. Any claims submitted for this date, will be grandfathered under the original 12 month policy.

Black history month is an annual celebration of achievements by African Americans and a time for recognizing the central role of blacks in U.S. History. Originally slated as Negro History Week, the celebration of the month was the brainchild of noted historian Carter G Woodson and other prominent African Americans. The theme for 2021 is The Black Family.

Other interesting facts:

- This event was first proposed at Kent State University in February 1969
- President Gerald Ford was the first President to recognize Black History Month in 1976
- February was picked to represent Black History due to it being the birth month of both Douglass and Abraham Lincoln.
- Black History was first celebrated in the United Kingdom in 1987 and Canada in 1995.

Notable people from Black History:

- Alain Leroy Locke was the first Black Rhodes Scholar
- Alexander L Twilight was the first Black person to earn a Bachelors Degree. He graduated in 1923 from Middlebury College in Vermont.
- Bessie Coleman was the first black female, in the world, to earn a pilot's license.
- Constance Baker Motley was a judge and the first black woman to serve in the New York State Senate as well as first black woman appointed to a Federal Bench as a judge.
- Georgia native, Eugene Jacques Bullard, became the first black military pilot to fly in combat and was the only black American pilot in World War I flying for the French Foreign Legion.
- Joseph Rainey of South Carolina, was the first black man to ever serve as member of the U.S. House of Representatives. He was a Republican.
- William Carney, of the Massachusetts 54th Colored Infantry unit during the Civil War, was the first black soldier to receive the Medal of Honor for his actions in the Battle of Fort Wagner in July of 1863.
- Richard Allen, a former slave, started the first church for blacks in the United States in 1787.
