Greetings! I hope this find you all doing as well as can be expected.

The VMAC in Gainesville, FL has updated the exam request process for Veterans who wish to schedule an exposure exam with Occupational Health. These exams are performed on Veterans who have had any type of environmental exposure based on war time service and deployment history and location. Some examples would be Vietnam, Desert Storm, Afghanistan,

Africa, the Nuclear/Tsunami accident in Japan and the Atoll Islands, etc.

The Veteran can request any and all exams pertaining to them specifically based on their military history and the results from these exams will be entered into your VA medical record.

Additionally, a Veteran DOES NOT have to currently be enrolled in the VA Healthcare system or have a service-connected disability in order to schedule an exam.

Lastly, I wanted to say thank you for all the support that has been given to me as the Post Service Officer this past year. I love, and thoroughly enjoy, helping our Veterans to ensure they get what they have earned. The incoming Service Officer, JT Miller, is an outstanding source of information and has a wealth of knowledge he can offer to our veterans. I will also be available to help anyone who needs assistance with their packages. When it comes to helping Veterans, the Post can NEVER have too many Service Officers.

- Operation Overlord was the code name for the invation.
- Over 150,000 Allied soldiers land on the shores of Normandy
- 5,000 vessels w/ 30,000 vehicles crossed the English Channel to France
- 13,000 men parachuted into France
- 11,000 planes were involved
- 9,000 Allied solidiers were dead or wounded after the first day
- D-day was originally scheduled for 05 June but weather delayed the invasion.
- U.S. troops stormed only two beaches while Great Britian and other smaller forces stormed Gold and Sword beaches and the Canadiens stormed Juno Beach.
- There were five beaches (sectors) of the invasion. Utah, Omaha, Gold, Sword, and Juno. These beaches are, today, still called by these code names.
- The landing craft boats used during the invasion were originally designed for use in the swamps of Lousiana.
- D-day is the largest amphibious invasion in history.
